Vocabulary

Bard: A poet, traditionally one reciting epics and associated with a particular oral tradition. For example: Literature has produced some exceptional bards.

Pre-eminent: Surpassing all others; very distinguished in some way. For example: Stephen Hawking is a pre-eminent physicist.

Pursuit: (In this context) the action of following or pursuing someone or something. For example: The cops were in pursuit of the bank robbers.

Convicted: Declare (someone) to be guilty of a criminal offense by the verdict of a jury or the decision of a judge in a court of law. For example: Winona was convicted of shoplifting.

Posing: (In this context) to represent oneself falsely; pretend to be other than what one is. For example: Strangers posing as repairmen are dangerous.
