Introduction

- Pirates of the Caribbean is a series of **fantasy swashbuckler** films produced by Jerry Bruckheimer.
- The “fantasy – adventure – comedy” series is based on the Walt Disney theme ‘Park Ride’ of the same name.
- The stories take place in a fictional historical setting; A large part of the world is ruled by a version of the British Empire, the British East India Company and the Spanish Empire. The pirates represent freedom from the ruling powers.
- The film series started with their first release on the big screen in 2003 with Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl, which received positive reviews from the critics and grossed US\$654 million worldwide.
