How is the Present Perfect Tense Formed?

The present perfect of any is composed of two elements:

The appropriate form of the auxiliary verb "**to have**" (present tense), plus the past participle of the main verb.

The past participle of a verb is **(action)+ed**,

e.g. *played, arrived, looked...*

Affirmative:		
Subject	<i>to have</i>	past participle
She	has	visited.
Negative:		
Subject	<i>to have + not</i>	past participle
She	has not (hasn't)	visited.
Interrogative:		
<i>to have</i>	subject	past participle
Has	she	visited?
Negative interrogative:		
<i>to have + not</i>	subject	past participle
Hasn't	she	visited?
