Vocabulary

Slate: in the past, a small, thin, rectangular piece of slate (= rock), usually in a wooden frame, used for writing on, especially by children.

Eraser: a small piece of rubber used to remove the marks made by a pencil.

Scribe: a person employed before printing was invented to make copies of documents.

Inscribe: to write words in a book or carve (= cut) them on an object.

To brew: to make beer. **OR** If you brew tea or coffee, you add boiling water to it to make a hot drink and if it **brews**, it gradually develops flavour in the container in which it was made.
