The Present Perfect Continuous Tense

- ✓ Present Perfect Continuous Tense is used to express an action which has started in the past, still continuing and not completed so far.
- ✓ In this tense, start time of action will always be: *for a few days, for ten months, for 2 years, since Wednesday, since 2011, since September, etc.*
- ✓ 'Start time of action' is the main factor which differentiates between Present Continuous Tense and Present Perfect Continuous Tense.

For example:

She is cooking.– Present Continuous Tense.

She has been cooking *since morning*.– Present Perfect Continuous Tense.



In the above example, only start time of action 'since morning' is the factor which is changing the tense of the sentence.
