Vocabulary

Ex-situ conservation: off-site conservation. It is the process of protecting an endangered species, variety or breed, of plant or animal outside its natural habitat

Extinct: (of a species, family, or other larger group) having no living members.

Forage: (of a person or animal) search widely for food or provisions.

Pristine: in its original condition; unspoilt.

Biomes: a large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna occupying a major habitat, e.g. forest or tundra.
