Vocabulary

Garner: to collect something, usually after much work or with difficulty.

Forensic Odontology: Forensic dentistry or forensic odontology is the application of dental knowledge to those criminal and civil laws that are enforced by police agencies in a criminal justice system.

Testimony: (an example of) spoken or written statements that something is true, especially those given in a law court.

Autopsy: the cutting open and examination of a dead body in order to discover the cause of death.

Exhume: to remove a dead body from the ground after it has been buried.

Profiler: a person who records and analyses someone's psychological and behavioural characteristics, so as to assess or predict their capabilities or to assist in identifying categories of people.

To scratch the surface: to deal with only a small part of a subject or a problem.
