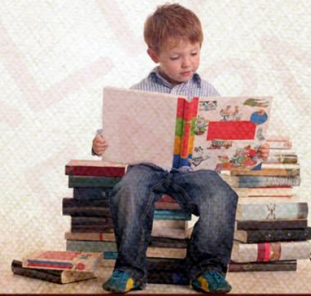

Vocabulary

Folk Tales: Part of folklore (traditions, customs and beliefs). These are stories passed down through the ages by word-of-mouth.

For example: Little Red Riding Hood is a popular folk tale.

Glimpse: Looking at something or someone for a very short time.

For example: He got a glimpse of the mystery guest while passing his father's room.

Societal Norms: Standards or accepted behaviour in a society.

For example: Single parents have changed traditional societal norms.

Settlement: A previously empty land which people build their houses on and form communities.

For example: A large Roman settlement has been discovered just outside the French town.
