VOCABULARY

To Sample: (In this context) To try something for the first time. E.g. We sampled a bit of local street food in Jamaica.

Thrill: Something that causes excitement or pleasure. E.g. The rollercoaster was a thrilling ride!

Nestle: (Of a building) To be half-hidden or obscure. E.g. The dim-sum joint was nestled between large bookshop and an antique store.

Array: An impressive display of things. E.g. The stall had an array of colourful scarves.

Eclectic: Something derived from many sources or ideas. E.g. The restaurant food choice was varied and eclectic.

To Find Something in Spades: In the most extreme or extravagant way or in large quantities. E.g. The rain came down in spades over the last 3 days and the city was flooded!

Miniature: A smaller size or replica of something. E.g. Keith likes collecting miniature car models.

Pretzel: A crisp biscuit baked in the form of a knot. E.g. Susan loves having a pretzel for breakfast.
