Vocabulary

Mold: a soft, green or grey growth that develops on old food or on objects that have been left for too long in warm, wet air.

Herald: to be a sign that something important, and often good, is starting to happen, or to make something publicly known, especially by celebrating or praising it.

Petri dish: a small, clear, round dish with a cover, used in scientific tests especially for growing bacteria.

Cusp: the dividing line between two very different things.

Bring to their knees: to destroy or defeat someone or something.

Prescient: knowing or suggesting correctly what will happen in the future.

Predecessor: someone who had a job or a position before someone else, or something that comes before another thing in time or in a series.
