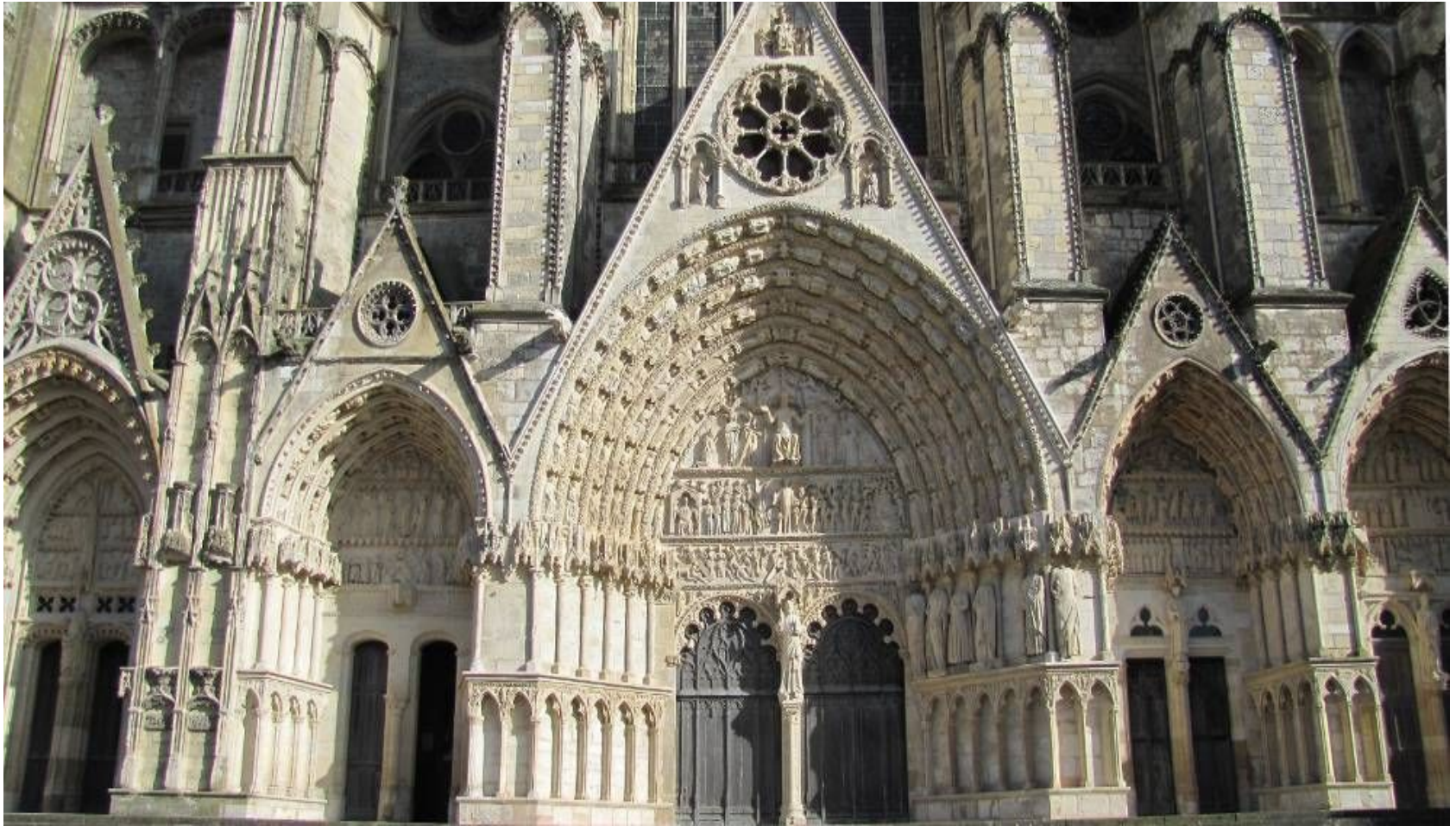


Architectural Theory



VOCABULARY

Hypothetical: Imagined or suggested but not necessarily real or true.

Implicitly: In a way that is suggested but not communicated directly.

Hieroglyph: A picture or symbol that represents a word, used in some writing systems, such as the one used in ancient Egypt.

Fresco: (A picture made by) Painting on wet plaster on a wall or ceiling.

Overt: Done or shown publicly or in an obvious way and not secret.

Ornate: Having a lot of complicated decoration.

Sustainable: (In this context) Causing little or no damage to the environment and therefore able to continue for a long time.
