VOCABULARY

Inculcate: instill (an idea, attitude, or habit) by persistent instruction. For example: It's good to inculcate good habits at home.

Span: the length of time for which something lasts. For example: Tia has a very short concentration span while watching movies.

Stimulate: encourage or arouse interest or enthusiasm in. For example: The teacher's ideas stimulated the class's interest in history.

Trove: a store of valuable or delightful things. For example: The neighbours have a garden containing a trove of exotic flowering plants.

Pop-Up Book: a book with pages that rise when opened to simulate a three-dimensional form. For example: Some children's books are pop-up books.
