

What is Adverb of Manner?

A word that describes the manner of an action is called **Adverb of manner**. It answers the question – **How** is the action carried out?

They are usually placed after the main verb or after the Object.

Examples:

He swims well.(after the main verb)
He plays the flute beautifully.(after the object)

Be Careful, The Adverb should **not** be placed **between** the verb and the object.

He ate **greedily** the chocolate cake. (Incorrect)
He ate the chocolate cake **greedily**. (Correct)

They form the largest group of adverbs.

We make most of them simply by adding -ly to their corresponding adjective.

Eg. Kind- Kindly, Quiet- Quietly

Adjectives ending with "L" add-ly;

Eg: careful- carefully, Graceful- Gracefully

Adjectives ending with "Y" change to -ily;

Eg: Lucky- Luckily, Angry- Angrily

Adjectives ending with "able" change to -bly

Eg: Responsible: Responsibly, Reasonable- Reasonably
