Introduction

Climate is described as a stable and relatively long-termed pattern of weather in a particular area. Different climates exist in different parts of the world. Some parts of the world are sunny and rainy almost every day. They are characterised by a tropical wet climate. Others are cold and snow-covered most of the year. They have a polar climate. The earth's biodiversity and geologic heritage is influenced by the various climates that exist between the **steamy** tropics and the icy poles.
