To contest- strife in argument; dispute; controversy.

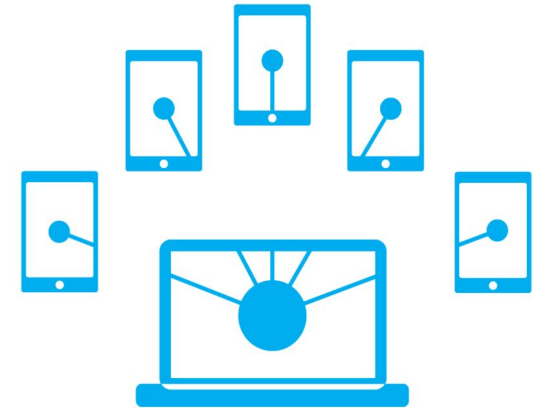
Amass- to collect into a mass or pile; gather.
