VOCABULARY

Economic Justice: Economic justice is a component of social justice. It's a set of moral principles for building economic institutions, the ultimate goal of which is to create an opportunity for each person to create a sufficient material foundation upon which to have a dignified, productive, and creative life beyond economics.

Biodiversity: the number and types of plants and animals that exist in a particular area or in the world generally, or the problem of protecting this.

Food Sovereignty: is the right of people to healthy and culturally appropriate food produced through ecologically sound and sustainable methods, and their right to define their own food and agriculture systems.

Climate Justice: is working at the intersections of environmental degradation and the racial, social, and economic inequities it perpetuates. Every living person depends on the environment.
