Introduction

Hong Kong became a colony of the British Empire after Qing China ceded Hong Kong Island at the end of the First Opium War in 1842.

Originally a sparsely populated area of farming and fishing villages, the territory has become one of the world's most significant financial centres and commercial ports.

Today it is the world's seventh-largest trading entity, and its legal tender the Hong Kong dollar is the world's 13th-most-traded currency.

The territory has the largest number of skyscrapers in the world, most surrounding Victoria Harbour.

The language spoken by most locals include Cantonese, Mandarin and English.
