Vocabulary

Outlets: ways in which emotion or energy can be expressed or made use of.

Insight: (the ability to have) a clear, deep, and sometimes sudden understanding of a complicated problem or situation.

Acquit: to decide officially in a law court that someone is not guilty of a particular crime.

Tortured: the act of inflicting excruciating pain, as punishment or revenge, as a means of getting a confession or information, or for sheer cruelty.

Sedition: conduct or speech inciting people to rebel against the authority of a state or monarch.

Court-martial: a military court.

Acronym: an abbreviation consisting of the first letters of each word in the name of something.
