



Vocabulary

Satire: the use of irony, sarcasm, ridicule, or the like, in exposing, denouncing, or deriding vice, folly, etc.

Comic: magazine with one or more comic strips.

anthropomorphize: to put human form or attributes to (an animal, plant, material object, etc.).

Sitcom: (Situation Comedy) A comedy drama, especially a television series made up of discrete episodes about the same group of characters, as members of a family.

Depiction: representation in image form, as in a painting or illustration. **Sandwiched:** (idiom) to insert between two other things.

Manga: Japanese graphic novel, typically intended for adults, characterized by highly stylized art.

Orb: a sphere or globe.
