What Is An Intensifier?

An intensifier is a word, especially an adverb or adjective, that has no meaning itself but is used to add force to another adjective, verb, or adverb.

The intensifier puts more stress on a word.

For example:

An **extremely** strong man.



It is a **very** interesting story.



In these two sentences, "extremely" and "very" are used as intensifiers, adding force to the words "strong" and "interesting".
