

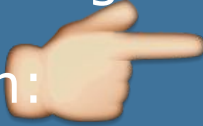

VOCABULARY

Rounded: well developed in all aspects; complete and balanced.

Set something back: delay or impede the progress of someone or something.

First-hand: (of information or experience) from the original source or personal experience; direct.

Counter culture: a way of life and set of attitudes opposed to or at variance with the prevailing social norm.

Intellectual capital: Collective knowledge (whether or not documented) of the individuals in an organization or society.

One-on-one: denoting or referring to a situation in which two parties come into direct contact, opposition, or correspondence. (in this context).
