Ceramicist: one who makes ceramic products or works of art.

Sublimated: diverted or modified (an instinctual impulse) into a culturally higher or socially more acceptable activity.

Interesting facts about Picasso

- Pablo Ruiz Picasso (25 October 1881 8 April 1973) was a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist, stage designer, poet and playwright who spent most of his adult life in France.
- Regarded as one of the most influential artists of the 20th century, he is known for co-founding the Cubist movement, the invention of constructed sculpture and the co-invention of collage.
- Among his most famous works are the proto-Cubist *Les Demoiselles d'Avignon* (1907), and *Guernica* (1937), a dramatic portrayal of the bombing of Guernica by the German and Italian air forces.
