VOCABULARY

Vivid: producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. For example: Sarah gave a very vivid description of the party.

Imagery: the use of words or pictures in books, films, paintings, etc. to describe ideas or situations. For example: The imagery of the poem relates to nature.

Tedious: boring. For example: The problem is, I find most exercises tedious.

Pattern: a particular way in which something is done, is organised, or happens. For example: The pattern of urban culture is changing.
