

# Pronouns - Rules



- Pronouns are small words that take the place of a noun. We can use a pronoun instead of a noun.
- Examples: **he, you, ours, themselves, some, each...**

We would have to say things like:

Do you like the manager? I don't like the manager. The manager's not friendly.

With pronouns, we can say:

Do you like the manager? I don't like **him**. **He's** not friendly.

In this way, pronouns help us use fewer words and avoid repetition.

# Subject Pronouns

Singular Pronoun	Example	Plural Pronoun	Example
<b>I</b>	<b>I</b> am a waiter.	<b>We</b>	<b>We</b> are married.
<b>He</b>	<b>He</b> is from London.	<b>You</b>	<b>You</b> are from Japan.
<b>She</b>	<b>She</b> is a doctor.	<b>They</b>	<b>They</b> are in my bag.
<b>It</b>	<b>It</b> is in my bag.		

We use **a subject pronoun** in place of a noun or name. In sentences like those above the subject pronoun is *the subject of the sentence*.
