



QUANTIFIERS

**Quantifiers state precisely or suggest approximately the amount or the number of a noun.**

**Some & Any :**

- “Some and any” are determiners and they express an indefinite quantity or number.
- “Some and Any” are used when it is not easy, necessary or important to say exactly how many / how much we want to mean.
- They are used with both countable and uncountable nouns.

**“Some” is often used in affirmative statements.**

**1. SOME + COUNTABLE NOUNS** : In this case, “some” means “a few”.

Examples :

- There are **some** postcards in my bag.
- There are **some** students in the class.
- There are **some** cherries in the basket.
- There are **some** mistakes in the list.
