

Quantifiers state precisely or suggest approximately the amount or the number of a noun.

Some & Any :

- "Some and any" are determiners and they express an indefinite quantity or number.
- "Some and Any" are used when it is not easy, necessary or important to say exactly how many / how much we want to mean.
- They are used with both countable and uncountable nouns.

"Some" is often used in affirmative statements.

1. SOME + COUNTABLE NOUNS : In this case, "some" means " a few".Examples :

 \succ There are **some** postcards in my bag.

 \succ There are **some** students in the class.

 \succ There are **some** cherries in the basket.

> There are **some** mistakes in the list.
