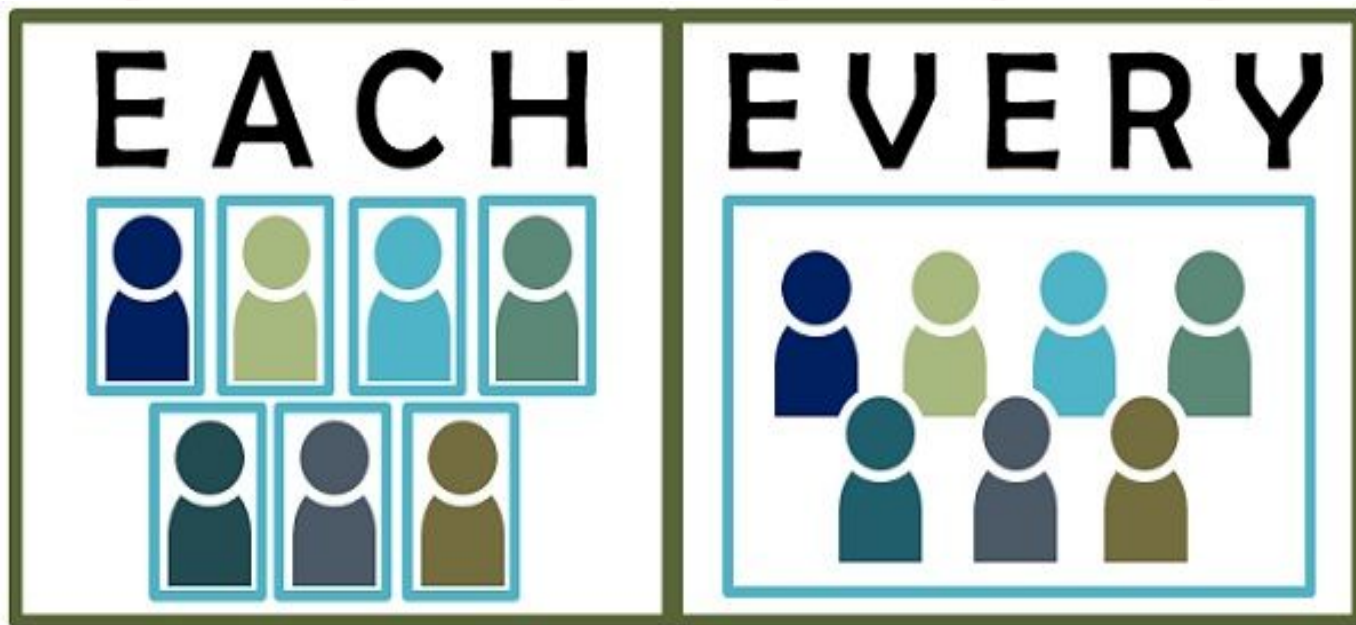


Quantifiers 'Each' and 'Every'



Introduction

When do we use each and when every?

The words *each* and *every* have similar meanings.

Each/Every time I go to work, the red car is parked in front of the office.



However, *each* and *every* are not always interchangeable. There are situations where you can either use *each* or *every*.

Uses of 'Each'

❑ 'Each' with singular and plural:

Each refers to a plural number of people or items, but it considers each person or item as an **individual** or **dissimilar** unit, it does not consider the group collectively. *Each* can also be used as a pronoun.

We use *each* to refer to the individual things or persons in a group of two or more:

*There were four rooms, **each** with wonderful views of the garden.*
