### Introduction

### When do we use each and when every?

The words each and every have similar meanings.

**Each/Every** time I go to work, the red car is parked in front of the office.

However, each and every are not always interchangeable. There are situations where you can either use each or every.

## Uses of 'Each'

#### □ 'Each' with singular and plural:

Each refers to a plural number of people or items, but it considers each person or item as an **individual** or **dissimilar** unit, it does not consider the group collectively. Each can also be used as a pronoun.

We use *each* to refer to the individual things or persons in a group of two or more:

There were four rooms, each with wonderful views of the garden.
