

Remember, Remind, Recall



→ Remember, remind, recall suggest the same idea, but differ in their grammatical form.



Remember

- If you **remember** something, you bring people or events to your mind.
- **Remember** can be used *transitively* (with an object) or *intransitively* (without an object). When used intransitively, it is often followed by *when-*, *where-* or *that-*clauses.
- Here is the model for **Remember** :

Animate subject + remember + someone + to do something + something

Examples:

- *I don't **remember** talking to you about Terry's divorce. I don't even **remember** you asking me about that.*
- *Do you **remember** when we first ate wild mushrooms?*
