## Remember, Remind, Recall



→ Remember, remind, recall suggest the same idea, but differ in their grammatical form.



## Remember

- → If you **remember** something, you bring people or events to your mind.
- → **Remember** can be used *transitively* (with an object) or *intransitively* (without an object). When used intransitively, it is often followed by *when-, where-* or *that-*clauses.
- → Here is the model for <u>Remember</u>:

Animate subject + remember + someone + to do something + something

## Examples:

- I don't **remember** talking to you about Terry's divorce. I don't even **remember** you asking me about that.
- Do you remember when we first ate wild mushrooms?
