Simple Past Tense

- Simple Past Tense is used to talk about a completed action in a time before now.
- The duration of the action is not important
- The action could have happened in the recent past or in the distant past.

The Simple Past Tense



walk - walked

eat - ate

Form

For regular verbs, add **-ed** to the root form of the verb (or just **-d** if the root form already ends in an e)

Examples : Play - played

Work - Worked

listen - listened

Positive - I walked today

Negative - I did not walk today

Interrogative Form - Did you walk today?
