

Simple Present Tense

Simple present tense is used to:

- describe habits, unchanging situations
- general truths and fixed arrangements
- give instructions and directions
- to express future actions after some conjunctions.

Note: - This tense is not used to express actions happening now.



Form

[VERB] + s/es in third person

Examples:

Positive Form

You speak English.

Interrogative Form

Do you speak English?

Negative Form

You do not speak English.
