**Socializing**: the action or practice of participating in social activities or mixing socially with others; the action or process of causing a person to behave in a way that is acceptable to their society.

**Coworkers**: a person with whom one works, typically someone in a similar role or at a similar level within an organization.

**Workplace**: a place where people work, such as an office or factory.

**Relationships**: the way in which two or more people or groups regard and behave toward each other.

**Productivity**: the effectiveness of productive effort, especially in industry, as measured in terms of the rate of output per unit of input.

**Apt**: suitable or right for a particular situation.

**Notch**: an imaginary point or position in a comparison of amounts or values; degree.
