Goof - a mistake made during film production that finds its way into the final released picture and which might seem funny or produce different effects on the viewer such as annoyance or loss in realism.

Anachronism - an error in chronology in which a person, object, event, etc., is assigned a date or period other than the correct one.

Hijack: illegally seize (an aircraft, ship, or vehicle) in transit and force it to go to a different destination.

Erratically - in a manner that is not even or regular in pattern or movement.
