

# SUBORDINATE CLAUSES



### What is a Subordinate Clause?

A subordinate clause is a clause that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence, because it does not express a complete thought. The reader is left wondering, "So what happened?"



#### Example:

**Unless Peter finishes his homework**, he will have to face the angry teacher tomorrow.

ALBERT

#### Example:

He left the office before I reached there

A long sentence with two small sentences and joined with 'before'
