Introduction

A *standardized test* is any form of test that requires all test takers to answer the same questions, or a selection of questions from common bank of questions, in the same way, and that is scored in a “standard” or consistent manner, which makes it possible to compare the relative performance of individual students or groups of students.

While different types of tests and assessments may be “standardized” in this way, the term is primarily associated with large-scale tests administered to large populations of students.
