

Use of Prefer & Rather

## RULES FOR USING "PREFER TO "(do)

• I don't like cities. I prefer to live in the country. OR I prefer living in the country.

Let's study the differences in structure after **prefer**.

## We say:

I prefer something to something else.

E.g.: I prefer this coat to the coat you were wearing yesterday.

- I prefer to do something rather than (do) something else.
- . E.g.: Ann **prefers to** live in the country rather than **to** live in a city.
- I prefer doing something to doing something else.
- . E.g.: I **prefer** driving **to** traveling by train.

## RULES FOR USING 'Would prefer (I'd prefer...)'

## We use:

"would prefer" to say what somebody wants in a particular situation.

E.g.: Would you prefer tea or coffee?

"would prefer to do" (not "doing"):

E.g.: "Shall we go by train?" "Well, I'd prefer to go by car. (not "I'd prefer going")

E.g.: I'd prefer to stay at home tonight rather than go to the cinema.
