When we want to give emphasis in a sentence, certain negative adverbs and adverbial phrases may be taken out of their normal position and placed at the beginning of a sentence or clause. In this emphatic construction the word order is inverted: the negative adverbial is placed first, an auxiliary verb follows it and the subject of the sentence comes next. E.g.

<u>Regular Formation</u>: He didn't speak a word. <u>Inverted Formation</u>: Not a word did he speak.

The two sentences mean the same thing. The only difference is that the second sentence is more emphatic.
