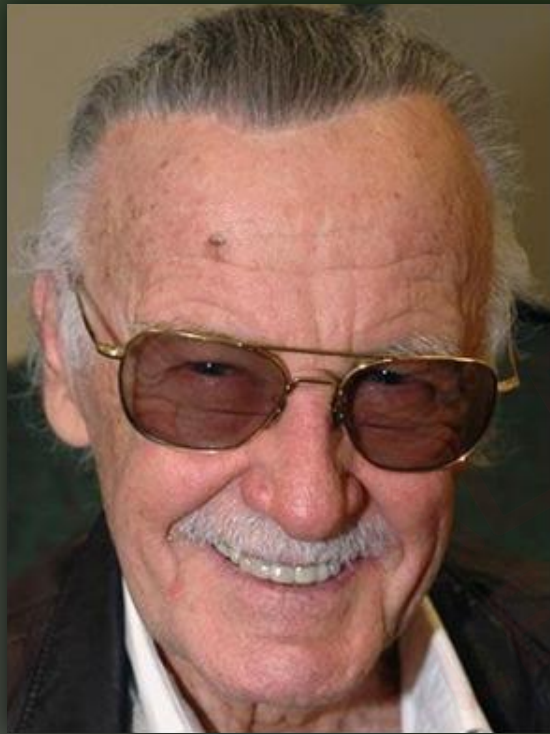

VOCABULARY

To Hold One's Attention: to keep someone riveted to you or to attract focus for a long period of time.

For example: His stories held people's attention at parties.

Fundamental: basic or essential.

For example: Some understanding of grammar is fundamental to learning a language.

Acrobat: a person performing difficult physical acts like jumping, balancing, etc.

For example: John's acrobats made his parents hold their breath out of fear he would lose his balance and fall!

Living Statue: people who paint themselves and their outfits to resemble statues.

For example: Cedric works as a living statue. His job is tough since he has to stay in the same pose for hours!

Orchestra Conductor: a person who directs a live orchestra with the use of a baton or hands.

For example: A good conductor is needed for an excellent orchestral performance!

Pantomime: make gestures without using words to express oneself.

For example: My pantomime was filled with childish laughter as I blundered on.
