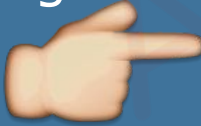

Meaning and Usage

- ❑ The Future Perfect Tense is used to express an action which will occur in or is thought to be completed in the future.

For example, **Maria will have studied tomorrow.**



This sentence shows a sense of completion of an action (study) which will occur in the future (tomorrow).

- ❑ The Future Perfect Tense often expresses that by the time one action or event happens, another will have happened.

For example, **They will have lived in 10 states once they move to New York.**
