Revisiting Comparatives and Superlatives

A comparative adjective is used to compare two things.

Example - Penny is **better** at math than Peter.

Superlative adjectives are used to describe an object which is at the upper or lower limit of a quality (the tallest, the smallest, the fastest, the highest). They are used in sentences where a subject is compared to a group of objects.

Example - Anna is the **best** at math from the entire class.
