

Either vs Neither

EITHER

VS

NEITHER



Either / or

Either / or: is used in a sentence when referring to a choice between two possibilities.

Examples:

- ❖ You can **either** call me at home **or** at the office.
- ❖ **Either** mum **or** dad will come to pick you up.



Other uses of Either / Or

- **Either** can also be followed by (one) of + group of two
i.e. you can use **either of** with a plural noun / pronouns

Examples:

- a. **Either of us** could do it (Either one of us could do it)
- b. I don't know **either of them** very well.
- c. There was no sound from **either of the rooms**.

- **Not... either... or** denies both possibilities:

Examples:

- a. I don't think either Mike or Lisa will be there.
- b. He doesn't speak either English or French.
