Vocabulary

- **Stationery** - writing and other office materials.
- **MFP (Multifunctional peripheral)** - an office machine which incorporates the functionality of multiple devices, such as a printer, fax, photocopier and scanner.
- **State-of-the-art** (as an adjective) - incorporating the newest ideas and the most up-to-date features.
- **Leaking** - (of a container or covering) accidentally losing or admitting contents, especially liquid or gas, through a hole or crack.
- **Blinds** - a screen for a window, especially one on a roller or made of slats.

Singular	There is	There isn't	Is there ?
Plural	There are	There aren't	Are there?
